These were the last words said by my Primary Flying Instructor Mr Cheang MJ before he stepped out of the aircraft for my first solo flight. His look of confidence in me was one that I would vividly remember.

I took a deep breath and started carrying out my pre-start checklist. Unlike any other sorties, I was on my toes, knowing that my instructor would not be around to take over the controls if anything goes wrong. Deep down, I was confident that I could takeoff, complete the circuit, and land safely. After all, I have done it so many times before and accumulated almost 30 dual flying hours in the air. When I touched down, all I said to myself was "I want to do it again!". That was my first solo and definitely would not be my last. It was indeed an experience I would never forget.

During BFC 1 and 2, the days only got tougher. There were some sorties that I did not perform up to expectations and I felt discouraged. Signing off bad grades on the sortie debrief forms was just demoralising. Soon enough, I understood that mistakes are sometimes inevitable, and being resilient would help me to adapt and continue to improve. Every time I felt disappointed in myself, I would recall the reason why I joined SYFC. No doubt giving up was an easy way out, but it was never in my options because I love to fly. I was determined to come back stronger and try again.

Through it all, I am very grateful to Mr Cheang MJ for guiding me along the way. He was strict with me but I know that he wanted me to takeoff and land safely each time I took to the skies. He strongly believed in me and had encouraged me through every sortie. Not only did he teach me how to become a better pilot, but also to become a better person in life. I am certain that Mr Cheang MJ will continue to inspire many of his students to appreciate flying. May it be good or bad times, I am truly grateful for all the moments we had flying together.

I would also like to thank Flying Instructors Mr Siva, Ms Tan SL, Mr Lee SL, and Mr Tan TT for being a part of my BFC journey. Without the tremendous support from SYFC, my family and friends, I would not have made it to achieve my first solo.

Nevertheless, I have understood that being able to fly an aircraft is a privilege and I must treasure this opportunity. Completing my first solo is not the end of my flying journey, but instead, I have reached the starting point.

FIRST SOLO FLIGHTS

We landed and taxied back to the parking shed where I dropped off my instructor. I started up the aircraft again and upon clearance, taxied out for the active runway. As I was taxiing, a voice in my head kept repeating my solo flight call sign "9V-YFG" as it was no longer "Skylark". Soon after, I lined up the runway and was awaiting takeoff clearance. Within seconds, I was airborne.



My fondest memory is of being about 50 feet off the ground, looking out over the left wing to see the airport going by, and realising I had finally achieved a childhood dream. I only had about two seconds to savour that memory before going back to the task at hand.

In a blink of an eye, I was on finals and soon after, the wheels touched the ground. These 20 minutes sure was a short one, but it was a once in a lifetime experience. I am extremely grateful and appreciative to my instructors for making this possible. This has been such an unforgettable journey thus far, and I cannot wait to see what the future holds!

FIRST SOLO FLIGHTS

FHT FLIGHTS

When I attended the National Day Parade during my primary school days, the aerial display of the F-15SG left a deep impression in my mind and sparked my interest in aviation. Later, I studied Aerospace Electronics in Polytechnic and a school trip to SYFC presented me the opportunity to sign up for SYFC's flying training course. From there, I embark on a 13-month long journey to achieve my Private Pilot Licence (PPL).

On 27 March 2022, I took my Final Handling Test (FHT) but failed. I was dejected. However, I believe that every setback is a learning opportunity for us to improve. With the support from my Flying Instructor and course mates, I re-attempt the FHT on the 30 March 2022, constantly reminding myself not to repeat the same mistake.



During the test, I was confined to executing the manoeuvres at 6,500ft overhead Seletar as there were clouds in most parts of the training area. Performing manoeuvres whilst circumnavigating the clouds was stressful. However, we were well trained and competent to adapt to any situation. Upon being told that I had passed the FHT, I was relieved and elated at the same time. 75.2 hours of flight training and hundreds of hours of preparation behind the scenes had finally paid off.

The PPL course taught me not only flying skills, but also inculcated in me the professionalism and values that an aviator should possess. I am thankful and indebted to my Primary Flying Instructor, Mr Raman, who made painstaking efforts to pass on his flying knowledge, moulding me into the confident and proficient pilot that I am today. It was also a blessing to have such a professional and efficient team of technicians who worked tirelessly to ensure the airworthiness of the aircraft before every flight. Having a common goal and passion, my course mates were strong pillars that supported me through this arduous journey. We learnt from each other to better understand the techniques and profile of each exercise and manoeuvres.
